Re: Board of Education Budget Process (2022) KTTA Stakeholder Response

Thank you for the opportunity to provide input on the Board of Education budget proposed for the 2022/2023 school year. After attending the April 5, 2022 budget presentation and reviewing the presentation documents, the Executive Committee of the Kamloops Thompson u se:

- Having now operated through two school years under pandemic and enhanced communicable disease protocols, the on-going need to prioritize the cleanliness and safety of schools is certainly evident. The KTTA supports the allocation of funds for maintaining day-custodial positions and the purchase of MERV-13 HVAC filters for improved air quality in buildings.
- 2. Recent updates to WorkSafeBC for the K to 12 education sector have brought increased attention to the risk of physical and psychological injury to workers in school settings. Psychological injuries are often invisible and un(der)-reported, with workers simply taking sick leave when their work situations are no longer manageable. This presents a significant financial cost to the employer, along with non-monetary impacts like reduced morale and a decreased sense of safety and well-being for students and staff.
