Eligibility

For an individual (i.e., This does not have to be an SD73 employee. It can be someone who has worked closely with SD73), group or organization to receive the award they need to have made significant, system-wide and outstanding accumulative contributions to public education in School District No.73 (Kamloops-Thompson) over five years or more, and have made a positive and major impact on the development of students, parents, teachers, support staff and educational leaders across the school district in any of the following areas:

- Student Learning/Teaching
- Athletics
- Fine Arts
- Community Well-being/Partnerships
- Extra or Co-Curricular Learning
- Administration and Support
- Governance

Nomination and Selection Process

Please submit a nomination package to the School Board Office, 1383 Ninth Avenue, Kamloops BC V2C 3X7, not later than March 31, 2024. The package should contain:

- A completed nomination form;
- Three letters of reference/support, sources other than the nominator and representing a broad range of interests;
- A description (2-page maximum) of how this individual, group or organization has made significant, system-wide and outstanding accumulative contributions to public education in School District No.73 (Kamloops-Thompson) over five years or more, and have made a positive and major impact on the development of students, parents, teachers, support staff and educational leaders across the school district in any of the following areas: Student Learning/Teaching, Athletics, Fine Arts, Community Well-being/Partnerships, Extra or Co-Curricular Learning, Administration and Support, and Governance.

Based on the documentation, a review panel (community members, superintendent, school leader(s), district leader(s), Aboriginal Education Council Member). The panel will review nominations and make a recommendation to the Board of Education for the award recipient for the year.
